

Abstract

Cohesion in Surat Al-Baqarah

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Since not all of the interpreters accepted the presence of "Cohesion" in the Noble Quran, so some of them rejected the subject unit in every Quranic Sura, or connection between that subject unit with its name, or the cohesion between its beginning and ending, and that between every sura and its adjacent, so this thesis aims to solve the problem.

In order to do so, I tried to answer the following questions: "Is there any connection between the beginnings of the suras, especially Al-Baqarah and there endings? What is the cohesion between the stories in the sura? Is there a subject unit in Al- Baqarah and other suras? What's the connection between the sura's name and its subject unit? And whether there are cohesion between every sura and its adjacent, so that the Quran is in ultimate cohesion from the first sura to the last without any kind of incoherence.

The significance of this thesis includes making obvious the meanings of the verses that seem to be ambiguous, proving the subject unit in Al-Baqarah, and the rest of the suras as a result, then proving that the Quranic suras are arranged by God, not by Man. Furthermore, the Noble Quran strongly refutes the claims of the orientalists.

The researcher follows the ethnographic method of research, which ranges from using the inductive and analytical method in interpreting the noble sura to equilibrating and preferring some opinions to others.

This thesis is divided into four chapters, the first of which is concerned with the introduction of the two parts of the title of the thesis, which are the sura of Al-Baqara and the topic of cohesion. The second chapter is concerned with the forms and kinds of cohesion in the Noble Quran. The third chapter aims at illustrating the forms of internal cohesion in the sura of Al-Baqara, whereas the fourth chapter is concerned with illustrating the forms of external cohesion in Al-Baqara.

Finally, this study concludes the topic unit in this sura, whose main topic is succession. The study also emphasizes the arrangement of the suras by God and the subject unit in the Noble Quran. The study concludes that most of the scholars are interested in the topic of cohesion, and among those scholars are Al-Razi and Al-Biqā'i.

The researcher recommends the following:

- . Minor topics such as the relation between the names of the suras and their themes and the cohesion between the suras that have the same beginning be studied.

- . The necessity of conducting research in the topic of cohesion, which was dealt with by Al-Razi and Al-Biqā'i.
